- Year 11- Students are expected to wear the new uniform, including the blazer.
- Year 12- Students are not expected to wear to the new uniform, but they must wear their blazer from Year 11 or purchase a new blazer.

Winter Uniform (Terms 2 & 3)

- · Students can wear long or short sleeved shirts.
- Female students: Students can wear socks or tights.
- Students are not permitted to wear non-school uniform clothing under their shirt, blazer or jersey e.g. undershirt or hoodie.
- Students can wear school tracksuit pants or shorts for sporting activities.


